eMINTS offer fresh access to technology

Third and fourth graders are preparing for their high-tech future now. That's why over the past year and a half Hillsboro Elementary has decided to introduce a new class called eMINTS. The class was formed to teach students about technology at an earlier age.

The acronym eMINTS is short for Enhancing Missouri's Instructional Networked Teaching Strategies.

The eMINTS classes are used to help the teachers and the students work together. All of the students have partners and do class assignments. The students are also able to use the Internet and access certain sites that the teacher has already chosen for them.

"I do mini lessons, then the students have a task to do on the computer," said Ms. Victoria Fricke, one of the eMINTS classroom teachers. "Then instead of lecturing, I go and help the kids as I'm needed."

"It promotes a higher

level of learning for the students, also allowing them then to ask higher level questions," Fricke said.

They learn to ask higher

level questions because they pretend that they are the people they learn about instead of just reading about the people

Many of the current services and programs that have made this district

what it is may be eliminated or reduced as a result of anticipated loss of revenue from the state. We receive revenue from only two sources: state or local. We get a few dollars from the federal government, but federal dollars are earmarked by law for remedial programs and special education. Since the state has indicated that our district will receive fewer funds next year, we either cut an equivalent amount of people, services, and programs, or we try to make up the dollars at the local level. The school board elected to do a combination of both. We will cut some of

Organizers consider Primary Bazaar a success

Teachers at the primary building held a Christmas Bazaar Dec. 6 to raise money to fund field trips.

"We were extremely pleased with the turnout of this fundraiser," said Jennifer Laiben, one of the teachers who helped to organize the bazaar. "It was very well attended. The parking lots were full. We had a steady crowd all day long."

There were a total of 45 booths at the bazaar. There were

five more booths than expected.

"The primary staff worked very hard and it was amazing to see the results of the teamwork in the final product," Laiben said.

"We had a coordinating committee of about 13 people. Almost all of the primary teachers participated in some way. The secretaries, custodians and cooks volunteered their time to help us on the day of the bazaar as well."

Laiben said one of the most popular attractions at the bazaar was the themed basket booth.

"Several of the classes at the primary school chose a theme for a basket. Students brought in donations of items relating to that theme. The baskets were packed and wrapped in several kinds of containers, including one in a bookshelf," Laiben said.

The baskets were numbered and displayed. Chances were sold for \$1 each or six for \$5.

"We sold over two thousand tickets," Laiben said. Baskets contained such items as books, movies, bath items, gift wrap, school sup-

plies and hockey tickets.

Not only was the event considered a success because its coordination went smoothly with so many volunteers, but Laiben said the money raised was impressive.

"We still have a little money coming in from our bazaar T-shirts," she said. "We have made over \$5000 at this point."

Volunteers organized the bazaar in order to raise money for field trips that had been canceled because of budget cuts already implemented this school year.

Doughnuts raise dollars for Primary building supplies

Biting into a hot, fresh, Krispy Kreme doughnut was a way of helping the Hillsboro Primary Building have the supplies it needs.

The primary teamed with Krispy Kreme to do a fund raiser that was appetizing, as well as effective. They sold Krispy Kreme Partnership Cards.

The cards were sold for \$10 each. The card is basically a buy-one dozen at regular price, get-a-dozen-free card. The card was good only for original glazed doughnuts.

After each free dozen, the card is punched, up to a total of ten free dozen doughnuts. There is a three free dozen limit per visit on the cards. The cardholder also has up to 18 months to collect the free dozens of doughnuts.

The Primary school made a profit of \$3000. Proceeds have gone directly into the Primary Activity Account.

The school plans to spend the money on computer supplies, classroom supplies, student rewards and attendance rewards.

from a textbook. They put themselves into that person's or group's position.

Securing the funds and equipment for such a high-tech classroom was a collaborative effort. Aimee Soloman came back from a yearly teachers' meeting saying how great the Smart Board was. Elementary principal Tony Duffner and Ms. Shannon Murray pushed for approval of the program, as well as a grant to fund it.

"As a classroom Computer Science teacher, I was aware of the eMINTs program, but I wasn't able to participate because it was targeted at the elementary level. One of my first goals was to get eMINTs started in our elementary school," said Steve Murray, R-3 Technology Director. "Early in my first year, it appeared that eMINTs funding wasn't going to be available and then the state received federal funding. I spent about one month on developing and writing the grant."

The elementary school was awarded this grant for the Smart Boards because the school already had a strong technology department. The grants for the eMINTs classrooms are

\$100,000 from the state, plus \$10,000 locally for the first year. For the second year, it was \$50,000 from the state and \$5,000 came from local funds.

Students say that they like the classrooms a lot and that while lessons are more challenging, they do have more fun with the Smart Boards.

"I'd rather be in this class because there is a lot of more stuff to do," Jessica McClanhan said.

"We don't always use the computer; they learn everything else using textbooks," Ms. Shannon Murray said.

The computers don't just help students at school. Participating in this program helps them in their everyday lives.

"It helps me for my Boy Scouts because you learn how to use the computer," Matt Brock said. "So that I can get the computer badge."

Fricke said it's amazing what the kids know. They go home and teach their parents what they have learned at school.

Currently there are four eMINTs classrooms in the Elementary Building. Those who have worked with the program say they'd like to see it expanded into the intermediate building someday.

the staff, services, and programs regardless, and we'll ask the voters to generate local revenue to offset the difference in state losses. All of the cuts will have a direct impact on students: larger class sizes, tutoring, At-Risk programs, Alternative School, gifted and honors opportunities, counseling, music, drama, sports, and many other student-focus services. A 54-cents increase will be on the April ballot.

We will also give voters an opportunity to help us make much-needed improve-

ments to our facilities. We have deferred fixing many of the major problems in our buildings, but we cannot wait any longer. We have heating, air-conditioning, and boiler replacement needs; several buildings need tuck-pointing; handicapped accessibility issues must be addressed; safety and security items must receive attention; general repairs to equipment, and deferred painting must be placed on the schedule, and upgrades to outside play areas need to be addressed. There will be a complete list available to the pub-

lic very soon. This bond issue is also on the April ballot, and the current levy will not increase.

Public education is a great investment, and the level of local support determines the quality of not only the school but the community as well.

Very soon, you will be given an opportunity to attend various information sessions, and you will be receiving district facts related to the tax increase and the bond issue. We encourage you to participate in these discussions.

All-day summer school for pre-K through 12th grade with both remedial and enrichment classes will be held June 1-30 (dates are tentative). Transportation provided; lunch served.
